

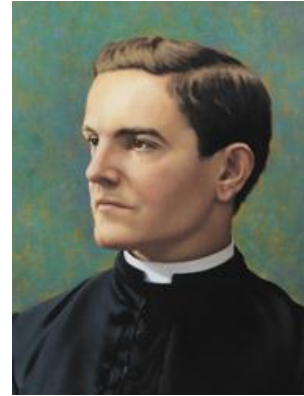

## **The feast of Corpus Christi Sunday**

In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host.

While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal.

The priest was immediately confused. At first he attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, the city where Pope Urban IV was then residing.

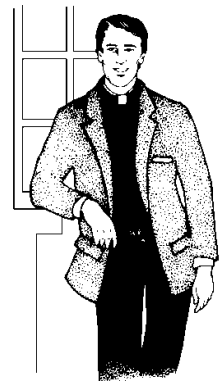
The Pope listened to the priest's account and absolved him. He then sent emissaries for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, he ordered the Bishop of the diocese to bring to Orvieto, the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood. With archbishops, cardinals and other Church dignitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto.

It is said that Pope Urban IV was prompted by this miracle to commission St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Proper for a Mass and an Office honouring the Holy Eucharist as the Body of Christ.

One year after the miracle, in August of 1264, Pope Urban IV introduced the saint's composition, and by means of a papal bull instituted the feast of Corpus Christi.

## Deputy Grand Knight's Message

Brother Knights,

### The Vatican has a chief advisor on AI named Benanti



Benanti is now the Vatican's chief advisor on AI, a role whose importance has grown alongside Pope Francis's concerns about the disruptive technology — which last year was used to generate viral fake images of the Pontiff wearing a snazzy puffer jacket.

Benanti believes that AI can be used to increase awareness of Vatican documents, but also worries that people may become too reliant on AI for decision making. Benanti suggests that "We need to give back to people the ability to decide by their conscience". Moreover, "The Pope is mostly worried about the effect AI can have on the elderly and on the most vulnerable among us," Benanti said. "He fears that AI could become a multiplier of injustice and inequality."

When I think about Generative AI, it is like giving a machine a bag of words and letting it put together sentences, stories and meanings. I wonder if, when we give an AI the words of the Bible, that it might create fictional stories that are not scripture. Although some may think that Generative AI may be a great way to improve awareness, I would be careful not to give the power of Truth to such fictions.

I would side with Benanti in that we should decide for ourselves through our conscience and let the original words and meaning of scriptures tell God's Truth for us to discover.

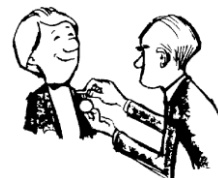
## Roses for Life

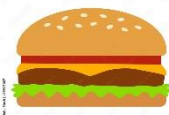
## Officers Elected for 2024-2025 Term
