

Jesus says to James and John in today's gospel, "Are you able to drink the cup that I drink or to be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized?" And James and John replied, "We are able." (Mark 10:38-39) James and John were willing to do Yes, whatever was necessary to make Jesus' gospel more known, more embraced, more lived-out by his followers. They were willing to take the lead, if need be, to make this happen. Thev were willing to make sacrifices of time, talent and treasure to spread the Gospel and to make connections with people unlike themselves. They were willing to be intentional missionary disciples and to go forth as Jesus' presence, in a world that often fought against the vision of the Kingdom of God.

Just as it was back then, today, the church celebrates our calling to reflect on the inclusive and urgent mission of the church to bring God's love to everyone and everywhere! It's called World Mission Sunday. It's a clarion call to allow others to experience the joy of Christ's message of reconciliation, peace, and joy by entering into their lives and accompanying them along the road to salvation! Pope Francis chose as the theme of this year's World Mission Sunday, "Go and invite everyone to the banquet."

According to this year's promotional materials, such an inspirational message invites us "to support financially and spiritually the work of over 1,150 territories worldwide where the Gospel has not yet been received, has only recently been embraced, or is courageously being upheld in the face of persecution." Our donations go to "support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the church is in its infancy or where the church is poor."

May we, too, have the daring of James and John to do the difficult and to lead in building a world marked by the pervasive presence of Jesus Christ in every corner, in every heart, in every soul. In this way, everyone will know that they are indeed invited to the banquet.


NEW TO THE PARISH? WELCOME!

If you or a child in grade 7 or older would like to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, we are now taking registrations.


HOW TO REGISTER — Fill in the <u>online</u> <u>registration form</u> that can be found on our website at <u>holyredeemersudbury.com</u>

The Paschal Mystery: Embracing Humility and Service

Fr. Richard Rohr discusses Jesus' patient teaching with his disciples, focusing on the concept of the Paschal Mystery-the way up being the way down. This profound mystery challenges our desires for power and prestige. The disciples also struggled to understand this truth and argued about their importance. Jesus reminds them that true greatness lies in being a servant to others. The disciples missed the point, longing for glory and positions of honor. Jesus emphasizes a new pattern of leadership: to be important, one must serve others. If only the Church had embraced Jesus' call to humility and service, peace and justice might have come sooner. This references the gospel for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B.


