

Building Blocks ...

hen Jesus hears the scribe's assent to his proclamation of love of God and love of one's neighbor, Jesus replies, **"You are not far from the kingdom of God."** Yes, our TODOS, TODOS, TODOS from the gospel this weekend includes EVERYONE in the entire world! It includes everyone because Jesus equates loving God with the equally important challenge of loving one's neighbor as oneself.

That means that we can't say we love God if we don't also love all those made in the image and likeness of God! It means that we can't only have a relationship with God; we also have to have one with others.

That means that our love of God is fake if we pick and choose whom we will love and whom we will hate. Such a fake love weakens and distorts our Gospel witness to a God who so loved the world that he sent his only begotten son, who suffered, crucified and died on a cross to extend to us God's unconditional and pervasive love. For us, that means that even though we may have difficulty loving some persons because of something they may have done to us or to someone else, we have to remain open to loving them with God's grace.

That doesn't mean that God's justice or God's just love no longer matters. All of us are accountable to God for our actions. But what it does mean is that though someone else's sin may be worse than my own, I can't make that an excuse for not being open to loving them and allowing God's mercy pour down upon them from the Precious Blood of Christ shed on the cross.
